### **STUDENTS AND FACULTY**

The Carmelites began the 2025-26 academic year on 2nd June 2025, warmly welcoming new students. Our school has 821 students from Play Class to Class 12, supported by 45 dedicated teachers and 26 supporting staff. Alongside core subjects, we offer specialized instruction in Communicative English, ATL, Dance, Karate, Band, Yoga, and Skating. To ensure a safe and engaging learning environment, the Principal delegated responsibilities to section coordinators.

### **A BRIEF LOOK AT OUR ACADEMIC MILESTONES**

“Great achievements begin with strong determination.” Our class X and XII students have made us proud with their commendable achievements in the board examination this year.

- Out of the 61 students appeared in class X AISSE examination, 10 students secured 90 above and Anna Toby emerged the school topper by securing 96%. Anna Toby and Cerin Biju made us proud by scoring full marks in Social Science and Neha Elsa Jogesh and Sera Jerry accomplished the same in Malayalam.
- Out of 43 students appeared in class XII AISSCE examination , Albin Babu attained Full A1, and 15 students passed with distinction and all the others bagged first class. Asin Maria Mathews (Science Stream) and Albin Babu (Commerce Stream) emerged as the school toppers by securing 93 % and 95%. Asin maria Mathews added yet another golden feather by achieving centum for Informatics Practices and Malayalam. Philip Philip reached another remarkable milestone by scoring centum in Business Studies.

## **THE MERIT DAY**

- The merit event was conducted on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2025 to honour the toppers of the AISSCE and AISSE examination. The chief guest Mr. T C Thankachan , Principal, St. Thomas College of Teacher Education Pala, reminded the students of their responsibilities and the importance to remain focused in their studies and dreams. Local manager Rev. Sr. Riya Therese CMC, graced the occasion with her presence and Adv. James M Vettom rendered a powerful message.
- For AISSCE and AISSE , prizes were given to School Toppers and students who secured 90 and above were given prizes. Toppers for each subject were also given the prizes.

## **PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION**

- Our PTA members are closely and actively involved in all the activities of the school. The PTA general body meeting was held on 12th July 2025. Dr. Mathew Kanamala, Professional Social Worker and Counsellor, conducted a class on ‘Effective Parenting’ for the parents. The new executive members were elected and Adv. James Mathew Vettom was re-elected as the PTA president and Mrs. Rose Mary Jacob was elected as Vice President.

## **TEACHERS' ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME**

Our teachers upgraded their skills through regular workshops and training. The Principal and staff attended CPD and Sahodaya programs on new educational trends, experiential learning, and recent curriculum updates.

- To improve the quality of English, the management organized an English Enrichment class for the entire teaching community on 6th June. The resource persons, Adv. Lenin Thomas and Mr. Sijo Joseph, brought great energy and valuable insights to the session.
- Some of our teachers participated in an IT enrichment programme organized by Kottayam Sahodaya and EY Learning Links on 22nd May 2025 at Labour India Campus, introducing the ERNST & Young STEM initiative for students, especially girls aged 13–18.
- A training programme on “Understanding NCF 2025” was attended by our three teachers on 5th July 2025 at Mangalam CBSE School, Ettumanoor.
- In pursuit of strengthening STEM education, three of our teachers took part in a workshop on ‘Future-Ready Strategies for Educators’ at Mar Baselios Public School Kottayam on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2025.
- Exclusive workshops for Hindi teachers were conducted this year. Four of our teachers attended sessions at Orchid Residency, Kottayam, on 30th October and 3rd November, focusing on NEP, Art Integration, and Holistic Development. Another workshop was also held at SFS Public School & Junior College, Ettumanoor, on 25th October.
- As per CBSE norms, a CPD training programme was organised on 15th November 2025 for teachers. With the theme “From Teacher to Guru,” the session guided teachers to refine teaching skills. The training was effective, engaging, and aligned with NEP 2020.

## **STUDENTS' ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME**

To prepare our students to face future challenges, we introduced several student enrichment programs, including career orientation, career guidance, and counselling sessions. These initiatives help students build confidence, gain knowledge, and support their overall development.

- ✓ The DC Books organized a two days book exhibition on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> July 2025. Through this, students realized the importance of reading and they were introduced different types of books for enhancing their communicative skills.
- ✓ On 17<sup>th</sup> June as the part of experiential Learning, standard IX students demonstrated one of their chapters in the Politics in relation to election and with the help of teachers they organized a polling section and carried out election process to nearly six positions. Master Mathew Jijo has been elected as Head Boy and Kumari Rebecca Sinto has been elected as Head girl. I congratulate both Mathew and Rebacca.

## **COMMUNICATIVE ENGLISH**

- ✓ Communicative English Leaders (CEL) were chosen and given badges.
- ✓ The English Box was placed on the campus for one month and students could drop their comments into the box.
- ✓ Various Speaking activities such as role play, Vocabulary building games, speech competition etc. for students were conducted on a regular basis. On the basis of the same each class is having an English Chart.
- ✓ CE Counseling is a way to get to know the children personally and understand what inhibits them from speaking out in English in the classroom environment
- ✓ Prizes – Whenever any student does something good / positive, wins a game or performs a task, they were given Prizes.

- ✓ Elegancia on the Air FM radio is an initiative by the English army in which each class presents Radio show. The highlight of this show is interview with a teacher.

### **HEALTH, WELLNESS AND VALUE EDUCATION**

Recognizing the importance of physical, mental, and spiritual well-being, the school provides counselling through our full-time counsellor, Sr. Litha Abraham, and spiritual guidance under Sr. Joicy. Both are readily available to support our students. In addition, value education and religious instruction classes for Catholic students continue to be an integral part of our curriculum.

**Counselling Hub:** Our school conducts programmes under the CBSE Counselling Hub, which creates a collaborative network to enhance psychosocial care and career guidance.
